How To Deal With Drug Problems in State's Foster Care Program California Healthline - December 11, 2014


An investigation and series of articles published this fall by the San Jose Mercury News and Bay Area News Group showed that pharmaceutical companies are spending millions of dollars to in-



Hotsheets

What are they? Hotsheets are direct referrals from the review board to the Court in cases where conditions persist that constitute a deterrent to reaching the permanency goals & compromise the health, safety or welfare of the child. (TCA 37-2-406)

How soon are they docketed? Within 30 days, usually within 2 weeks. If it is an "emergency situation" (i.e. risk of harm) it is set within 72 hours. They are set on the Magistrate's docket who regularly hears the case (i.e. one family one judge). The Court Liaison to the board files the motion and notifies parties to appear. There are times when a board member, usually the Chairperson, may be asked to attend the hearing.

How does the board find out what happened in Court? After a board makes a referral the case is set for a verbal review the following month and the Court Liaison reports what happened.
